Dear brothers and sisters of our Lord Jesus Christ, on this day the Church begins a holy season of prayerful and penitential reflection. Our attention is especially directed to the holy sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ.

From ancient times the season of Lent has been kept as a time of special devotion, self-denial, and humble repentance born of a faithful heart that dwells confidently on God's Word and draws from it life and hope.

Dear Father in heaven, on this Day we ask that you empower us with Your Holy Spirit, on behalf of Your beloved Son Jesus Christ the Messiah. Father, please, richly Bless us as we enter into this Lententide. Lord, we ask that you use our Lenten journey to fill us with the compassion and love that Jesus has for us to love each other and bring us to the celebration of the Resurrection with glad hearts as we keep the feast in sincerity and truth.

⁷But God was displeased with this thing, and he struck Israel. 8And David said to God, "I have sinned greatly in that I have done this thing. But these sheep, what have they done? Please let your hand, O LORD my God, be against me and against my father's house. But do not let the plague be on your people."
