



P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the thirteenth chapter.



rose they were scorched. And since they had no root, they withered away. ⁷Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. ⁸Other seeds fell on good soil and produced grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. ⁹He who has ears, let him hear. . . .

hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what has been sown in his heart. 


PRAYER OF THE CHURCH
