SCRIPTURE READINGS

Pastor: Isaiah 53:3

Pastor: Isaiah 53:4

Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted.

Pastor: Luke 23:38-43



SENTENCES

- P We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You;
- C by Your cross and precious death You have redeemed the world.
- P The Lord has laid on Him the guilt of us all.
- C He was smitten for the people's transgressions.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Pastor: Isaiah 53:5

But He was wounded for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities; upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with His stripes we are healed.

Pastor: John 19:25-27

But standing by the cross of Jesus were His mother and His mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw His mother and the disciple whom He loved standing nearby, He said to His mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" Then He said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.

PRAYER

P Let us pray. O Lord Jesus Christ, You have said: "Take My yoke upon You and learn from Me; for My yoke is easy, and My burden is light." Grant that, as You bore Your cross willingly for love of us, we may bear our cross for the love of You. Give us grace in every trial and temptation, and save us by Your cross and passion.

All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned---every one---to his own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.

Pastor: Mark 15:33-34

And when the sixth hour had come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?" which means, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?"

Pastor: John 19:29-30

A jar full of sour wine stood there, so they put a sponge full of the sour wine on a hyssop branch and held it to His mouth.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Pastor: Isaiah 53:12b

He poured out His soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet He bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.

Pastor: Matthew 27:50-54

And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and yielded up

his spirit. And behold, the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. And the earth shook, and the rocks were split. The tombs also were opened. And many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised, and coming out of the tombs after his resurrection they went into the holy city and appeared to many. When the centurion and those who were with him, keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were filled with awe and said, "Truly this was the Son of God!"

P Let us pray. Almighty and everlasting God, out of tender love toward Your creation, You sent Your Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, to become our flesh and to suffer death on the cross.
