L A reading from 1 Corinthians, chapter 15.

¹Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which
you received, in which you stand, ²and by which you are being saved, if you
hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain.

³For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that
Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁴that he was buried,
that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁵and
that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. ⁶Then he appeared to more
than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though
some have fallen asleep. ⁷Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles.
⁸Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. ⁹For I am the
least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the
church of God. ¹⁰But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace
toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of
them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. ¹¹Whether
then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

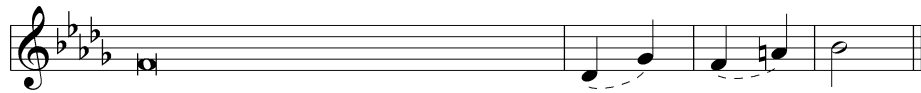
THIRD READING

John 20:1–18

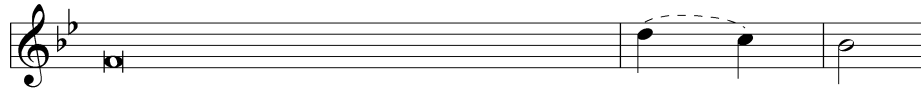
L A reading from John, chapter 20.

¹Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early,
while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the
tomb. ²So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one
whom Jesus loved, and said to them, “They have taken the Lord out of the
tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him.” ³So Peter went out with
the other disciple, and they were going toward the tomb. ⁴Both of them were
running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb
first. ⁵And stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did
not go in. ⁶Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb.
He saw the linen cloths lying there, ⁷and the face cloth, which had been on
Jesus’ head, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself.
⁸Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in, and he
saw and believed; ⁹for as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that he
must rise from the dead. ¹⁰Then the disciples went back to their homes.

look into the tomb. ¹²And she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body



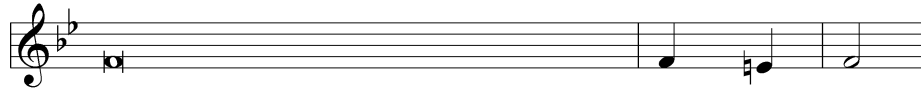

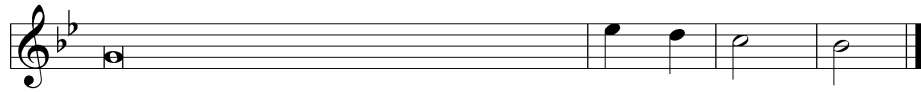
